
# FACILITATING SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP LEARNING ACROSS DIVERSE GROUPS TO HELP THEM DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT THEIR SOCIAL CHANGE IDEAS OR ENTERPRISES

CSIM equips individuals with the skills and knowledge to address social challenges through entrepreneurship. CSIM offers specialised training programs, resources, and mentorship to cultivate impactful leaders dedicated to driving positive social change.

#### Post Graduate Diploma in Social Initiative and Management (PGDSIM)

Since **2001**, the Post Graduate Diploma in Social Initiative and Management (PGDSIM) served as CSIM's flagship course, combining academic rigour with fieldwork to prepare future social entrepreneurs. PGDSIM emphasised both theory and hands-on experience, featuring workshops, skill-building, and expert-led project reviews.

In **2015**, CSIM introduced PGDSIM at **Queen Mary's College**, Chennai, where second and third-year Sociology undergraduates attended classes thrice weekly, with **172** students completing the program.



In 2020, the course was paused as CSIM shifted focus to specialised trainings tailored for students, farmers, and for-profit social entrepreneurs, evolving to meet diverse needs in social entrepreneurship education



#### Social Entrepreneurship Outlook Programme (SEOP)

The **Social Entrepreneurship Outlook Programme (SEOP)** is a certificate course designed for both current and aspiring social work professionals and social entrepreneurs, offering foundational insights into social entrepreneurship. Launched in 2006, SEOP has enrolled **651** students to date, providing them with a deeper understanding of the social entrepreneurship landscape and its role in sustainable development.

#### **Learning Objectives:**

Participants gain a comprehensive understanding of social entrepreneurship principles, strategies for building sustainable business models, and approaches for effective fundraising and resource mobilisation, equipping them with skills to create and sustain impactful social ventures.

#### **Course Structure and Topics:**

- >>> Duration and Schedule: This 40-hour program is conducted over four months, with classes held every Saturday from 2:00 P.M. to 6:00 P.M. at CSIM's premises.
- >>> Core Topics: SEOP covers essential areas, including legal aspects, fund development, social research, social marketing, management tools, project and finance management, human resource management, and accountability.
- >>> Instructional Approach: The course extensively utilises case studies to provide practical insights and applications.

SEOP has benefited a wide array of individuals, including NGO leaders and staff, transgender individuals, government and corporate employees, and college students, expanding the reach of social entrepreneurship education across sectors.





#### **Social Entrepreneurship Outlook Programme for NGOs**

Launched in **2006**, the course has enrolled **369** students, providing them with a comprehensive understanding of social entrepreneurship and its role in promoting sustainable development. This course is conducted at CSIM premises, and the curriculum covers key topics such as the fundamentals of social entrepreneurship, the impact of social enterprises on sustainable development, and strategies for developing effective business models. Additionally, the course delves into fundraising and resource mobilisation, equipping students with the skills needed to secure resources for their social ventures.

#### **Business with Purpose (BWP)**

Business with Purpose course was launched by CSIM in 2022-2023 to provide a more targeted approach to social entrepreneurship. The curriculum includes modules such as the **Business Model Canvas**, which helps participants design and visualise their business models for social enterprises. This course is aimed to deepen participants' understanding of how to create sustainable and impactful business strategies aligned with social goals.

In the 2023-2024, this course was conducted at Tindivanam with **22** participants enrolled. The group consisted of 9 farmers, 6 businessmen, 3 NGO heads, 2 NGO staff members, and 2 homemakers. This diverse mix of participants reflected a wide range of backgrounds, all focusing on learning how to integrate social impact with business practices.

The **Social Entrepreneurship Outlook Programme (SEOP) in Natural Farming** is a specialised course launched in **2023** benefiting **40** farmers. This course provides participants with practical and theoretical knowledge essential for sustainable farming practices. This program equips learners with key skills to promote natural farming methods in alignment with environmental stewardship and sustainable agriculture. The course is led by a team of resource persons, including experienced organic farmers, agronomists, and environmental experts.

#### **Curriculum:**

- >>> Agro-Climatic Zones in Tamil Nadu: Understanding regional climates and how they impact farming practices.
- **Seasonal Cropping and Crop Rotation Systems:** Techniques to enhance soil fertility and manage resources efficiently.
- **Biodiversity, Environment, and Ecosystem Functions:** Exploring the role of biodiversity in sustainable agriculture and ecosystem health.
- >>> Land Selection and Fertilization Techniques: Criteria for choosing land and natural fertilization methods to boost productivity.
- >>> Irrigation Management Technologies: Efficient water management approaches tailored to natural farming.
- >>> Pest and Disease Management: Strategies for pest control that align with natural and organic farming principles.
- >>> Seed Selection, Protection, and Integrated Farming: Guidance on choosing resilient seeds and integrating diverse farming systems.

This program empowers participants to implement eco-friendly and sustainable farming techniques, fostering a balanced ecosystem while supporting agricultural productivity.

#### **SEOP in Deaddiction Counselling & Treatment Techniques**

Launched in 2008 in partnership with CONCERN, a Chennai based de-addiction centre, this course was designed to meet the growing demand for skilled professionals in addiction recovery. Since its inception, 246 participants have enrolled, with 35 graduates going on to establish their own de-addiction centres. All alumni actively contribute to de-addiction initiatives across the region, creating a specialised workforce dedicated to supporting addiction recovery and rehabilitation.

#### **Special Trainings**

CSIM's collaboration with **Bosco Institute (BI)**, **Jorhat**, underscores a shared vision of nurturing capable social entrepreneurs through comprehensive training, handson mentorship, and systematic evaluation. To foster youth leadership and drive social transformation across Northeast India, BI initiated The Youth Involve (YI) Fellowship.

In 2024, following a rigorous selection process, **23** aspiring social entrepreneurs were chosen to participate in CSIM's tailored **10-day training** program. Delivered in two intensive 5-day sessions in February and April 2024, the program offered these fellows essential resources, mentorship, and opportunities for skill enhancement. Under the expert guidance of Dr. Archana Pillai, Ms. Latha Suresh, and Ms. Marie Banu, the participants developed problem-solving skills and gained insights into measuring the impact of their ventures.



To deepen their learning, virtual mentoring sessions in **March 2024** focused on refining project proposals and building Business Model Canvases. This mentorship prepared the fellows to address social challenges effectively, ensure the sustainability of their initiatives, and enhance the credibility of their strategies. Additionally, a special online session on emotional intelligence, led by Dr. Kalpana Sampath, supported their personal and professional growth.

As part of the program, the fellows were mentored to present their projects at the Pitch Fest organized by BI in June 2024. After careful evaluation by the lead team and interviewers, **13** outstanding candidates were selected to advance their initiatives, marking a significant milestone in their entrepreneurial journey.





# RAISING AWARENESS OF SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP AMONG COLLEGE STUDENTS

To expand the youth's understanding and interest in social entrepreneurship CSIM organises workshops, seminars, and customised courses for college students. These initiatives aim to showcase the value and impact of social entrepreneurship on society, inspiring more people to support and engage in social impact activities.

#### **Diploma in Social Initiative and Management (DSIM)**

Launched in **2022**, the DSIM program is offered to I year B.A. Sociology students of Queen Mary's College providing specialised training in social initiative and management. Classes are conducted twice a week over a two-year period, allowing students to balance their core studies with this practical, skill-focused curriculum. In the 2023-2024 academic year, **46** students enrolled in the program, gaining valuable insights and tools for managing social initiatives effectively.

# College Connect

CSIM partners with leading educational institutions across India and offers customised courses/ workshops for college students & faculty.

















#### **Social Connect programme**

Social Connect programme is conducted for students of Stella Maris College, SSS Shasun Jain College for Women, and Sri Kanyaka Parameswari Arts & Science College for Women in Chennai. A maximum of **35** students per batch are enrolled for this programme. So far, **261** students have participated in this programme. The students are taken on field visits to social work organisations and are provided block placement opportunities at NGOs.



#### Online course in Social Entrepreneurship (E-SEOP)

In September 2010, CSIM launched its **Online Course in Social Entrepreneurship** in collaboration with Cognizant Technology Solutions. This online program explores the intricacies of entrepreneurship with a social focus, offering participants the knowledge and skills to make a positive social impact.

#### Course Structure and Topics:

*Curriculum:* The course covers critical areas of social entrepreneurship, including legal aspects, fund development, social marketing, management tools, project management, finance management, human resource management, and Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). In 2015, Cognizant Technology Solutions updated the course to include a dedicated CSR module.

**Learning Tools:** Short films and documentaries on successful social entrepreneurs serve as case studies, providing real-world examples. Additionally, webinars are held throughout the course, allowing participants to interact with instructors and guest experts.

#### **SOCIAL AUDIT NETWORK-INDIA**

Social Audit Network, India (SAN India), a project of MSDS Trust, conducts social audits and impact assessments to improve transparency, professionalism, and accountability within social enterprises. Social audits are essential for ensuring transparency, accountability, and effective resource use in social development programs. They provide a platform for community participation, enabling stakeholders to assess the impact of initiatives, identify gaps, and ensure that goals are met. These evaluations ensure that social enterprises can Prove and Improve their Social impact, benefiting their communities and other stakeholders.

#### **Social Audit Master Class**

The Social Audit Master Class, launched by SAN India in May 2014, is designed to equip individuals or groups with the principles, methodologies, and tools required for conducting social audits. Social auditing evaluates an organisation's performance in relation to social, ethical, and environmental standards.

#### **Key Topics Covered:**

- >>> Understanding the concept and principles of social auditing.
- Conducting a social audit, from planning to reporting.
- Identifying relevant social, ethical, and environmental standards and expectations for social enterprises or CSR programs.
- Collecting and analysing data from various stakeholders, including beneficiaries, employees, suppliers, and partners.
- Developing effective communication strategies to engage stakeholders and communicate findings and recommendations.
- >>> Using social auditing as a tool for fostering continuous improvement and accountability.

The Social Audit Master Class, conducted by Social Auditors from the Social Audit Network, India,. This program has successfully completed 12 batches, with 192 participants enrolled and 23 Social Auditors certified.

# **Projects assessed**






SAN India launched the Social Impact Practitioner (SIP) training in **2018** to groom Social Impact Practitioners in a focused and systematic manner. This training emphasises understanding the different dimensions of social impact, distinguishing between outcomes and social impact, and conducting stakeholder consultations. It covers measurement tools including OECD framework, data collection methods and stakeholder consultation tools. The course also outlines the resources necessary for effective social impact measurement.

- >>> The SIP program is designed to:
- >>> Elucidate the functions, values, and expectations of Social Impact Assessments.
- >>> Foster professionalism among impact practitioners.
- >>> Align practitioners with global trends in sustainability assessment and development.

The SIP training has completed six batches, enrolling 77 participants and certifying 12 Social Impact Practitioners.






